Notable Adult Fiction

Tana French's second novel, *The Likeness*, brings back the character of Cassie Maddox, now a detective on the Domestic Violence squad having left the Murder squad after her trying last case. Cassie plans to permanently stay off of the Murder squad until the murder of her exact double is discovered. And the murdered woman has been using Cassie's old undercover identity Alexandra "Lexie" Madison. Cassie's boyfriend, Sam O'Neill, detective on the murder squad and Frank Mackey, Cassie's former boss when she was undercover, have asked Cassie to step in as Lexie Madison once again. Instead of having been murdered, "Lexie" will have miraculously been wounded and she can return to her home with her four friends, whose friendships remain shrouded in secrecy. There Cassie will get to work to unravel the mystery behind the real Lexie Madison's murder.

Well-defined characters and a fast-paced plot with elements of both mystery and thriller keep the reader turning pages. French writes another gripping novel that keeps the reader guessing until the very end.

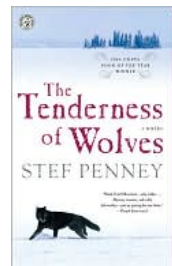

Books for Children and Young Adults

New to the children's shelves this month :

Fred Stays With Me by Nancy Coffelt is the story of a little girl who sometimes stays with her mom and sometimes stays with her dad –but Fred, her dog and constant companion stays with her!

Monkey and Me by Emily Gravett is about stuffed monkey and the little girl who owns him. They go to the zoo and imitate the animals they see. Nice rhyme to it and easy to “read” pictures.

Ookpik by Bruce Hiscock tells the story of a young snowy owl and how he survives his first year. Hiscock describes the terrain, climate and the survival instincts that a bird such as Ookpik must experience. There is an author's note in the back that gives the reader the vital statistics about this beautiful bird.

We Are the Ship by Kadir Nelson tells the story of the Negro baseball league in a remarkable book he also illustrated. Starting with the “first inning “ and finishing with “extra innings.”
